1. A player who is cautioned must leave the field and must be replaced by a substitute.
 - a. True

2. The referee awards a penalty kick to Team A with 20 seconds remaining in the game. It takes 30 seconds before the PK is taken. The keeper deflects the ball directly back to the kicker, who then kicks the ball directly into the goal. The referee should award a goal.

3. Either team may substitute an unlimited number of players, provided they have checked in with the AR or 4th official, in these specific situations:
 - a. Any corner kick and any throw-in
 - b. Any goal kick, after cautions and disqualifications, and when a player is required to leave the field because of communicable disease concerns (bleeding)
 - c. Only after the coach screams "SUB! SUB!" multiple times

4. Player A2 is in possession of the ball at midfield when Team B's coach uses foul language toward the referee. The referee stops play to disqualify the coach. The game should be restarted with a drop ball from the point where the ball was when the game was stopped.

5. During halftime, a player, who had been on the field during the first half of play, directs offensive and abusive language toward the referee and he is given a red card. His team may start the second half with 11 players.
